- **Early warning systems** of organization at risk how to identify (Indicators) and prevent risks "in time" to become effective.
- Specific early warning signals such as 'acting on suspicion of sepsis' as an early warning system for quality and safety. Can it improve effectiveness?
- Integrated Care Exchange of good practices and experiences between Health and Care organizations How to improve quality and safety? What are the results? What is the role of the supervisory organization in promoting co-operation and sharing data?
