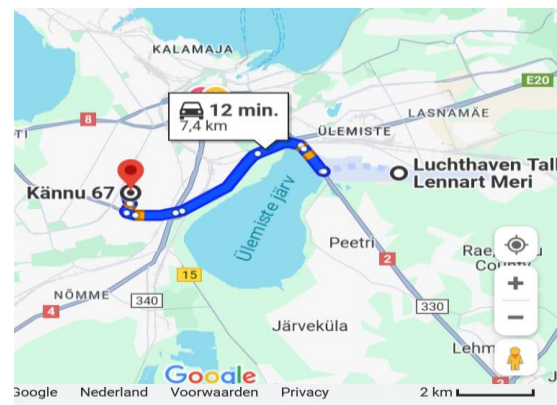
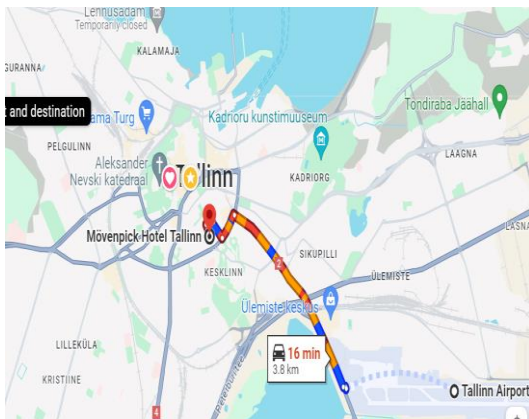
Getting to the Conference Hotel from the airport:

By Taxi Taking a taxi is also a good option They take about 15 minutes to reach the hotel and cost approximately 8-10 euros.

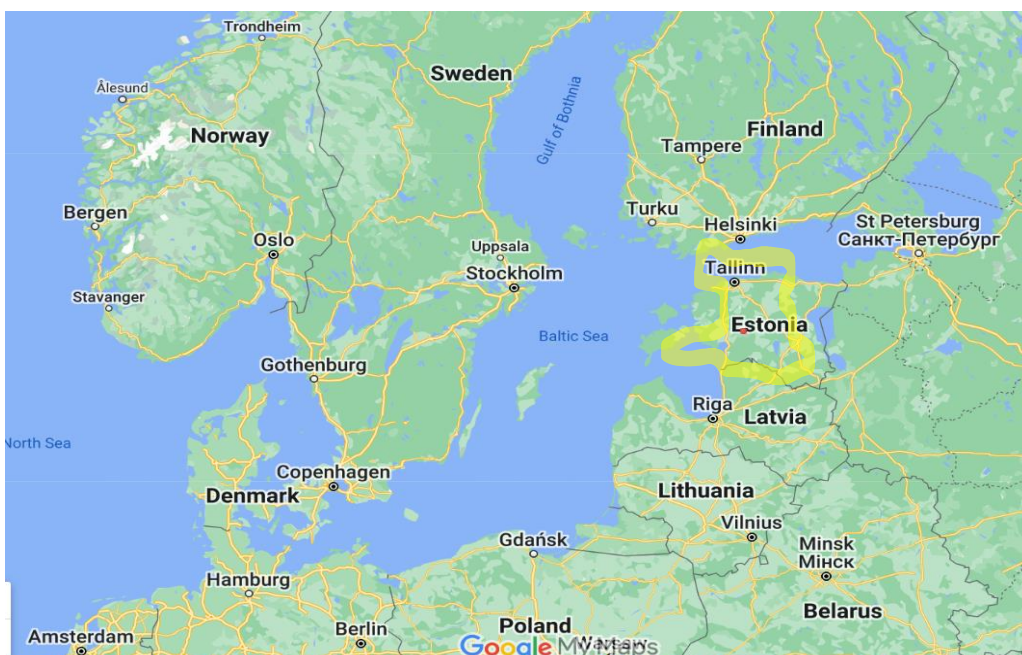
Getting to the pre- Conference on the 28th of May see map
