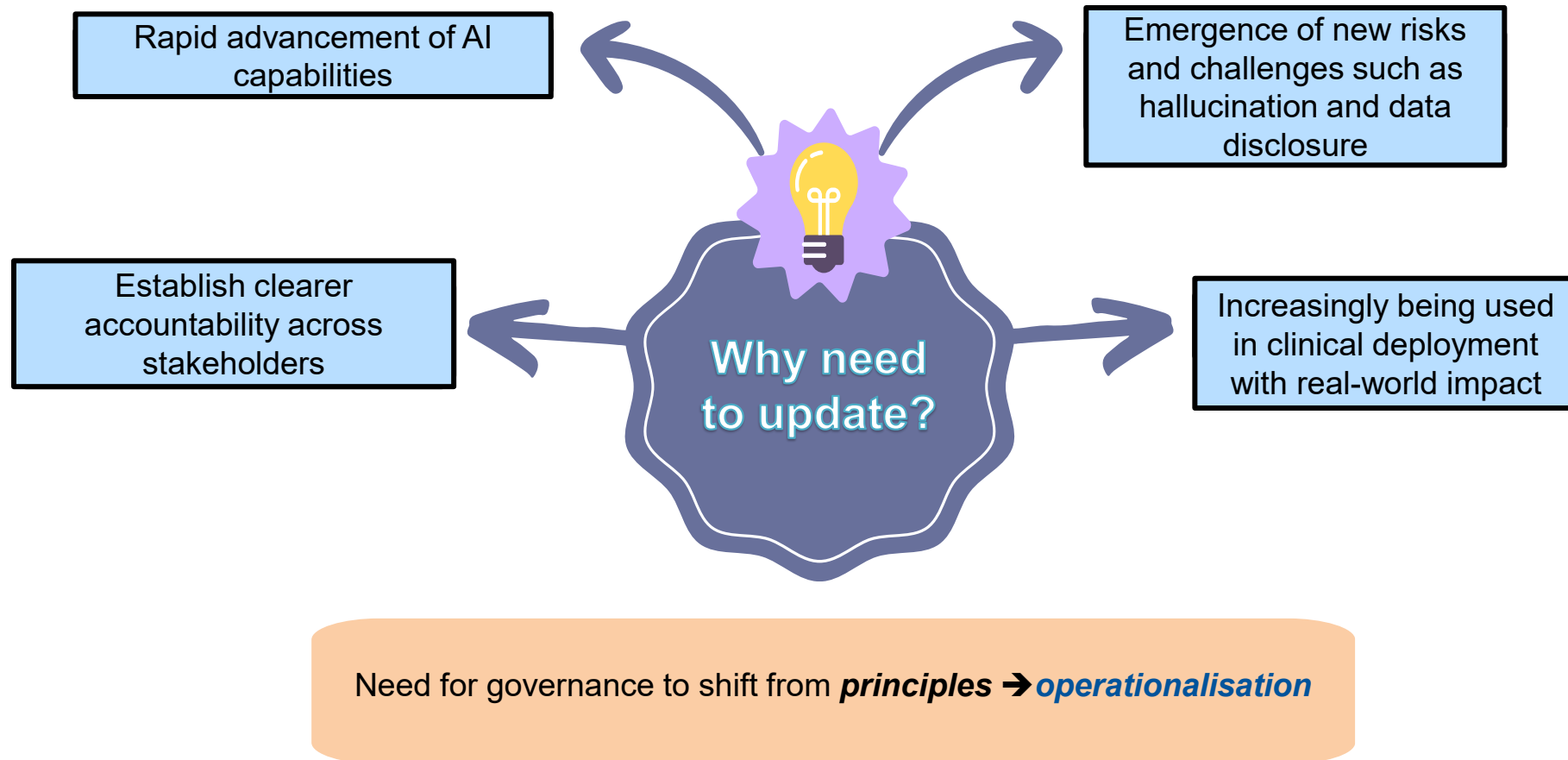

- ❑ **Aim:** To support the safe and responsible design and use of AI in healthcare



Updated the national AI in Healthcare Guidelines (AIHGle 2.0)

Key Updates vs 2021 Version

- Clarifies on roles and responsibilities – developers, deployers, user (i.e. healthcare professionals).
- Clearer accountability across the ecosystem.
- Updated guidance for Generative AI.
- Guidance will continue to be updated as AI technologies and safeguards evolve.

Evaluate model performance, safety and compliance across the product lifecycle



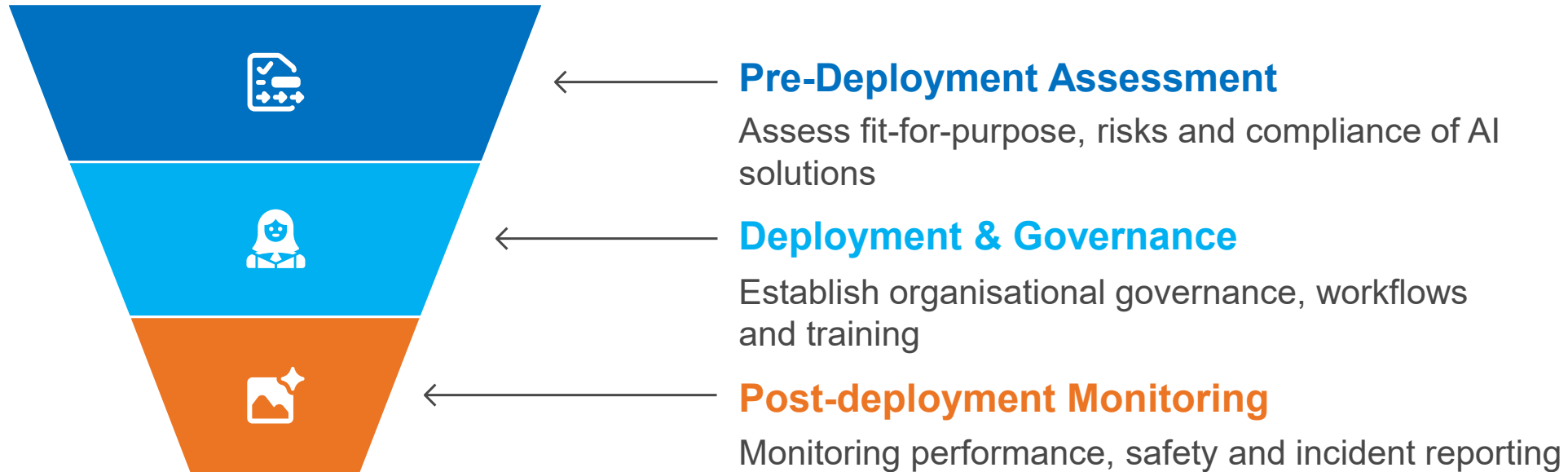
